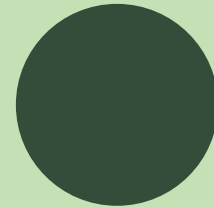
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# Why Do It?

<i>Asparagus</i>	Tomatoes, parsley, basil.	<i>Chervil</i>	Radishes ( <b>improves growth and flavor</b> ).	<i>Marjoram</i>	Here and there in garden.	<i>Rue</i>	Roses and raspberries; <b>deters Japanese beetle. Keep it away from basil.</b>
<i>Basil</i>	Tomatoes (improves growth and flavor); said to dislike rue; <b>repels flies and mosquitoes.</b>	<i>Chives</i>	Carrots; <b>plant around base of fruit trees to discourage insects from climbing trunk.</b>	<i>Mint</i>	Cabbage family & tomatoes, <b>deters cabbage moth.</b>	<i>Sage</i>	Rosemary, carrots, cabbage, peas & beans; <b>deters some insects.</b>
<i>Beans</i>	Potatoes, carrots, cucumber, cauliflower, cabbage, summer savory, most other vegetables and herbs, & around houseplants when set outside.	<i>Corn</i>	Potatoes, peas, beans, cucumbers, pumpkin & squash.	<i>Nasturtium</i>	Tomatoes, radishes, cabbage, cucumbers; <b>plant under fruit trees; deters aphids and pest of cucurbits.</b>	<i>Southern-wood</i>	Cabbage; plant here and there in garden.
<i>Beans (bush)</i>	Sunflowers ( <b>beans like partial shade, sunflowers attract birds and bees</b> ), cucumbers (combination of heavy and light feeders), potatoes, corn, celery, summer savory.	<i>Cucumbers</i>	Beans, corn, peas, radishes, & sunflower.	<i>Onion</i>	Beets, strawberries, tomato, lettuce ( <b>protects against slugs</b> ), beans ( <b>protects against ants</b> ), summer savory.	<i>Soybeans</i>	<b>Grows with anything, helps everything.</b>
<i>Beets</i>	Onions & kohlrabi.	<i>Dill</i>	Cabbage ( <b>improves growth and health</b> ), carrots.	<i>Parsley</i>	Tomato & asparagus.	<i>Spinach</i>	Strawberries.
<i>Borage</i>	Tomatoes ( <b>attract bees, deters tomato worm, improves growth, &amp; flavor</b> ), squash, strawberries.	<i>Eggplant</i>	Beans.	<i>Peas</i>	Squash ( <b>when squash follows peas up trellis</b> ); <b>grows well with almost any vegetable; adds nitrogen to the soil.</b>	<i>Squash</i>	Bean &, onions; <b>deters bean beetles.</b>
<i>Cabbage family</i>	Potatoes, celery, camomile, sage, thyme, mint rosemary, lavender, beet & onions.	<i>Fennel</i>	<b>Most plants dislike it.</b>	<i>Petunia</i>	Protects beans, <b>beneficial throughout the garden.</b>	<i>Strawberries</i>	Bush beans, spinach, borage, lettuce (as border).
<i>Carrots</i>	Peas, lettuce, chives, onions, leeks, rosemary, sage & tomatoes.	<i>Flax</i>	Carrots & potatoes.	<i>Pot Marigold</i>	<b>Helps tomato, but plant throughout garden as deterrent to asparagus beetle, tomato worm and many other garden pests.</b>	<i>Summer Savory</i>	Beans, onions; <b>deters bean beetles.</b>
<i>Catnip</i>	Plant in borders; <b>protects against flea beetles.</b>	<i>Garlic</i>	Rose and raspberries ( <b>deters Japanese beetle</b> ); helps herbs with their production of essential oils, plant liberally throughout garden to deter pests.	<i>Pumpkin</i>	Corn.	<i>Sunflower</i>	Cucumbers.
<i>Celery</i>	Leeks, tomatoes, bush beans, cauliflower & cabbage.	<i>Geraniums</i>	Near grapes ( <b>discourages Japanese beetles</b> ).	<i>Radish</i>	Peas, nasturtium, lettuce, cucumbers; <b>as a general aid in repelling insects.</b>	<i>Tansy</i>	Plant under fruit trees; <b>deters pest of roses and raspberries; deters flying insects; also Japanese beetles.</b>
<i>Camomile</i>	Cabbage & onions.	<i>Horseradish</i>	Potatoes ( <b>deters potato beetle</b> ), around plum trees to discourage curculios.	<i>Rosemary</i>	Carrots, beans, cabbage, sage; <b>deters cabbage moth, bean beetles and carrot fly.</b>	<i>Tarragon</i>	<b>Good throughout garden.</b>
		<i>Leek</i>	Onions, celery & carrots.			<i>Thyme</i>	Chives, onion, parsley, asparagus, marigold, nasturtium, carrots & limas.
		<i>Marigolds</i>	<b>The workhorse of pest deterrents! Keeps soil free of nematodes; discourages many insects. Plant freely throughout the garden.</b>			<i>Turnip</i>	Peas.
